<u> 2 Year Olds</u>

This week the children have had a scarily fabulous week, we have been carving out pumpkins to make scary faces. Once our pumpkins were ready we carried a science project to see if we could make it erupt like a volcano. The children loved watching how by mixing the different ingredients we could make it bubble and explode. We have also been busy making some Halloween buns ready for our Halloween party. The children had a fantastic time at our party, we played pass the parcel and had prizes for the best dancers. We have also been melting some spooky ice hands to reveal some scary creatures; the children used their fine motor skills by using the pipette to squirt water on and pouring salt on top to make the ice melt.

3 Year Olds

The 3 year old nursery children have had a fun filled week of Halloween activities. We have been exploring a variety a media to create a bat, ghost or pumpkin and we have had some sensory fun mark making in the ghastly foam. The children enjoyed apple bobbing, pass the parcel and musical bumps at the Halloween party. The children looked very scary in their costumes and they gave the adults a fright! This week we have also had a successful Phonics breakfast; thank you to all the parents/guardians who came along to support their child.

Reception

This week in Reception the children have been creating collages of spiders in their Expressive Arts and Design lessons and learning about their features linked to our learning about Halloween. In our Understanding the World lessons the children have carved pumpkins, learning about safety when using tools, which they thoroughly enjoyed! The children have been learning about size in their maths lessons, using mathematical language to talk about the size of different objects and ordering them by size. We have had daily RWI lessons where the children have learned new sounds and practiced blending and segmenting words with Fred the frog to help them read. The children have had their weekly news lesson where they have been writing about what they have done over the weekend using their phonic knowledge to sound out and write simple words and sentences. The children have been persevering with their pencil grip and letter formation in our handuriting lessons and have been practicing tracing and forming The children have had their letters. weekly dancing lesson with Natalie where they have started to learn their Christmas Carnegie dance. They have taken part in a PE lesson with Amy where they have been developing their gymnastic skills.

Year 1

What a busy, but exciting first week we have had back after the half term holidays. As scientists we have explored the season of autumn in more detail. We have explored what the weather is like, what clothes we could wear, the activities that we could do and what the tree looks like in our playground. As young writers, we have been making links to our RE lesson, where we have been answering questions about what Eid-al-Fitr and Ramadan are and why they are celebrated. With it being Halloween this week, we had the opportunity to create our very own scary monsters and used exciting adjectives to describe them. As mathletes this week, we have been consolidating our knowledge of positional language. On Friday, we had the opportunity to watch a fireworks display in the playground.

Year 2

This week year 2 have been involved in a Heart Start course where the children have been taught emergency lifesaving skills, which could be used to help a person until the emergency services arrive. All the children listened very carefully and participated in the practical activities. As mathematicians we have continued our learning of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. The children have a good understanding that the multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (commutative). Through our topic challenge question of Where would you rather live Cumbria or the North Pole and why?' our literacy lessons will work alongside the book 'The Princess and the White Bear King' to inspire us as writers. Having only been given the front cover of the book, we had to be like Indi the Imagining Indian Elephant to predict what we think might happen in the story. As scientists we have started to look at the seasonal changes in weather. Over the next few weeks we will be observing the weather carefully and identifying any changes that have occurred.




