
# Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March

#### <u>2 Year Olds</u>

This week some of the children have enjoyed celebrating their 3rd birthdays, the children always look forward to cake and singing the birthday song. The children have been using their fine motor skills to make finger print sheep. We have been learning the Nursery Rhyme of the week, 5 little ducks, singing it round the water tray to enhance the children's learning.



## <u>3 Year Olds</u>

The children have been persevering to write their first name during adult led activities. They have been

identifying 2D shape and talking about their characteristics. The children are becoming very confident when spotting shapes in the environment and talking about the shapes they have found. The children have also been matching pairs of animals to recreate the story of Noah's Ark

#### <u>Year 2</u>

As mathematicians this week we have finished looking at 2D shapes. We finished this area by looking at describing patterns, moving shapes and turning shapes. We have now moved onto looking at 3D shapes. So far we have looked at recognising the different 3D shapes and also describing them. Discussing how many sides and vertices the different shapes have.

As young and upcoming writers we have planned our very own worm story. We used a storyboard to note down the different eastings of the

different sections of the story and any key information we were going to include and illustrations to trigger our imagination just like Indi the Imagining Indian Elephant. Once



the plans were completed we wrote our very own worm adventure story and they were very detailed and imaginative. 


