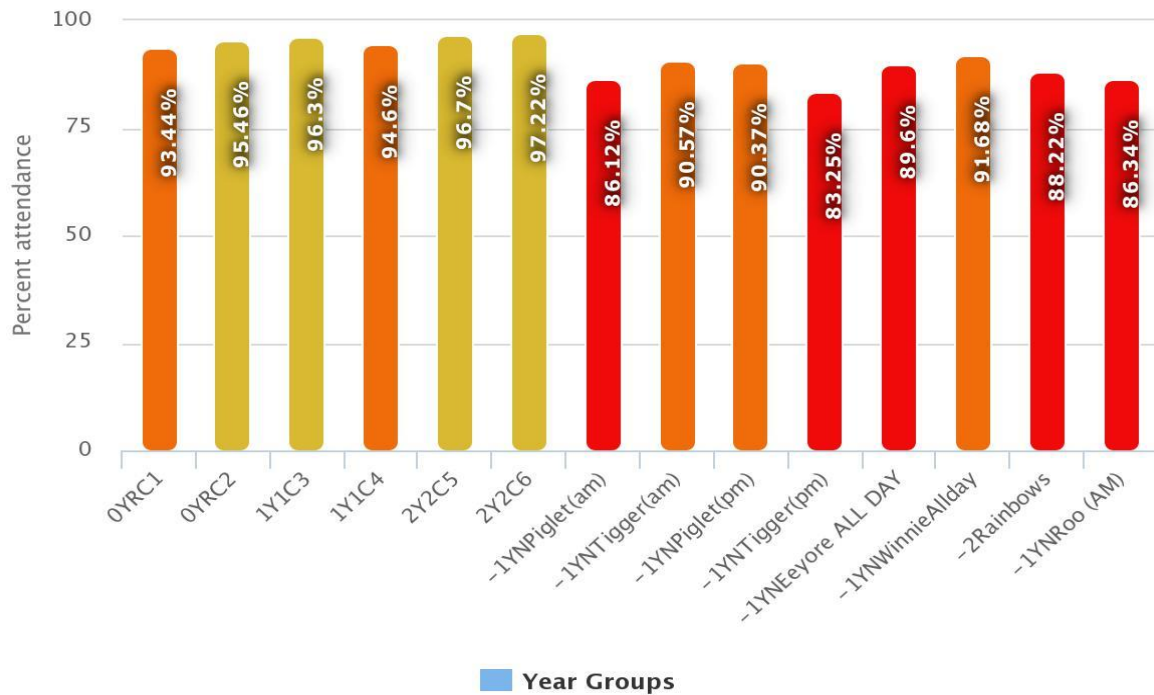

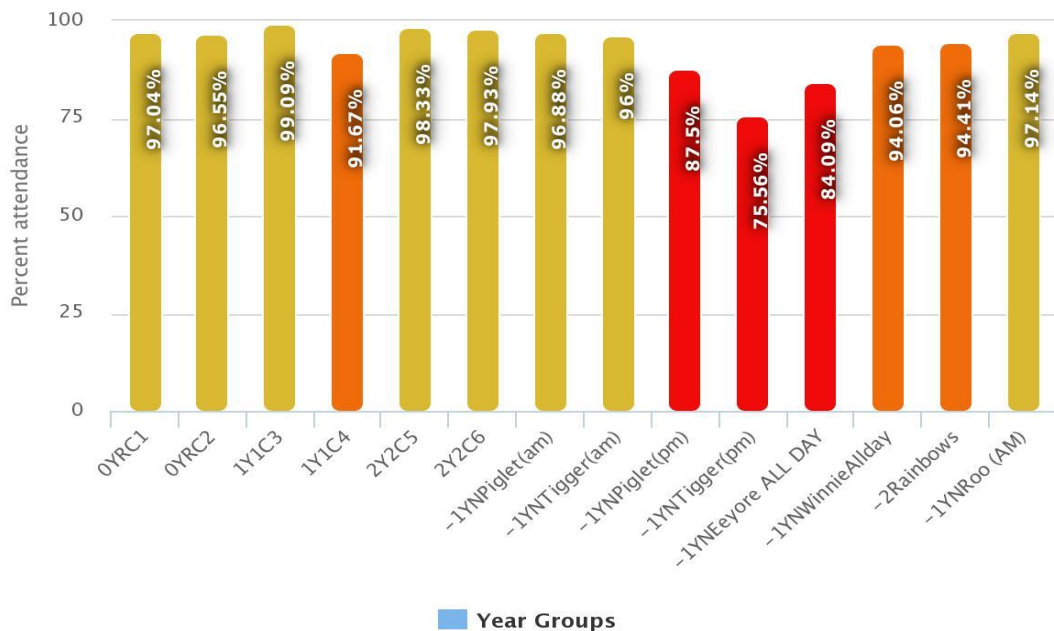




Whole School Attendance 3rd September - 22nd March 2019
